**Keuka Lake Association to Hold Their Annual Meeting on July 8, 2023**

**June 9, 2023** –The Keuka Lake Association will hold its annual meeting on Saturday, July 8<sup>th</sup>, at Keuka College. It will start at 8:30 with registration and a continental breakfast. Presentations will begin at 9:00 AM.

Topics to be covered include election of members of the Board of Directors, a report on the financial status of the organization and the introduction of scholarship winners. There will be an update on the "State of the Lake" by Lisa Cleckner from the Finger Lakes Institute and reports on the current KLA programs to deal with water quality concerns including hazardous algae blooms, starry stonewort and other invasive species.

There will be boating safety reports from the Sheriffs' Marine Patrols, both Steuben and Yates Counties, as well as an update on the health of the fisheries from the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation. The KLA representative to the Keuka Lake Outlet Compact (KLOC) will provide a report on the programs to control lake level and the current outlook for this year.

Steve Brigham, KLA President, said "This is a great opportunity for members to get updated information about much of what the KLA does throughout the year. This is a volunteer organization which touches almost every area in the collective Keuka Lake community, so we are encouraging anyone with an interest in Keuka Lake and its water shed to join us in our mission and attend our meeting."
